1.0 Position Purpose

The Research Fellow position will contribute to the institute's research profile by undertaking independent and collaborative research, analysing complex data, and disseminating findings to both academic and policy audiences. Research conducted will focus on green energy finance and green energy trade in Asia with a focus on China, Australia, Southeast Asia as part of a flagship project of Griffith Asia Institute. Within the project, we are looking to understand the interaction of local policy on green energy, foreign investment and trade across Asia.

The candidate will produce high-impact policy-relevant and academic outputs and support the organization and delivery of workshops and conferences.

2.0 Eligibility Requirements

- A PhD in in a relevant discipline, particularly Economics and Finance, awarded no more than three years prior to the application closing date. (Candidates who have submitted their thesis but have not yet been conferred are encouraged to apply).
- Demonstrated research and practical experience in a relevant field with an emerging track record of public and policy-relevant publications and engagement.
- Excellent skills in trade and investment data analysis, with proven experience in using international databases (e.g., IMF, World Bank, UNCTAD, or similar).
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills, with a proven ability to write clear, concise policy notes and academic papers.
- Proficiency in Chinese language (reading and writing) preferred.
- In depth knowledge of green energy finance and trade policy particularly in an Asian context.
- The ability to work independently, manage time effectively, and collaborate as part of a research team.

3.0 Key Responsibilities

- Collect and analyse data on green energy, trade and investment policy, green energy trade and investment including using local government and public sources (e.g., China, Indonesia, India)

- Prepare and publication of research papers in high-quality academic journals.
- Translate of research findings into accessible policy notes, briefs and presentations for government, industry and wider public.
- Support event and workshop organization
- Supervise and support junior researchers and students.
- Actively contribute to the academic life of the Institute work effectively with stakeholders.
- Ensure compliance with relevant legislation and University policies and procedures, including research ethics, equity and health & safety, laboratory standards and exhibit good practice in relation to same.
- Be a leading example of the principles and values embodied in the University's Code of Conduct, and behave, act and communicate at all times to reflect fairness, ethics and professionalism.
