

4. Purpose of the Position

Working with a great team of fellow professionals, in a friendly and supportive environment, the trainee Cardiac Sonographer role in CDS entails the following services for in-patients and out-patients of Epworth Richmond:

Using available technology and following internationally recognised (ASE) guidelines, under supervision train to be able to competently perform and provide:

- 1. Transthoracic cardiac ultrasound scans (echocardiograms) of high diagnostic quality
- 2. Imaging and ECG monitoring for stress echocardiography
- 3. Assistance to the CDS nurse and cardiologist during transoesophageal echocardiography
- 4. Imaging as needed as a procedural adjunct e.g. pericardiocentesis, structural heart interventions
- 5. Taking part in the rostered on-call out-of-hours echo service once deemed competent
- 6. Holter monitoring and ambulatory blood pressure monitoring placement and interpretation
- 7. Undertake training in cath lab
