Medical Professionals are responsible for managing a dept/unit and may be involved in caring for patients across a diverse range of wards including neurology, cardiology, orthopaedic, physical rehabilitation, general medical and psychiatry. As a result the support needs of patients will vary dependent upon their age, physical ability, cognitive capacity and behavioural challenges. Medical Professionals can be responsible for administering medication, attending to a wide variety of medical needs and may be required to monitor and manage any health related conditions or concerns. Support may also be required for mobility assistance with patient transfers and as such a high degree of manual handling is associated with the role
