POSITION PURPOSE

The MECSH Local Implementation Nurse Consultant (LINC) will support the implementation of the world-leading MECSH program of sustained nurse home visiting in Australia with a focus on NSW. The LINC will work with the MECSH Implementation Project Lead, researchers, clinicians, clinical leaders and service managers to support them to effectively implement the MECSH program with quality and reorient their service. The position will require domestic travel.

KEY ACCOUNTABILITIES

1. Provide support for sound MECSH clinical practices pertaining to Sustained Health Home Visiting (SHHV) across the MECSH program sites in Australia with a focus on NSW.
2. Provide support and advice regarding quality implementation of the MECSH program.
3. Provision of MECSH face to face and virtual training.
4. Maintenance of detailed records of issues, and the advice and responses given, to facilitate consistency of program implementation and meet compliance and audit requirements.
5. Promotion and facilitation of the MECSH community of practice.
6. Promotion and facilitation of MECSH local governance and clinical supervision.
7. Facilitate provision of training and implementation resources for MECSH sites.
8. Ensure compliance with university policies and external regulations in all aspect of service delivery.

QUALIFICATIONS, EXPERIENCE AND SKILLS

1. Tertiary qualifications in nursing with a minimum of 3 years' experience in professional practice in an area relevant to child and family health, including, but not limited to, child and family health nursing, paediatrics, perinatal mental health, or women's health.
2. Demonstrated ability to deliver training programs and provide reflective practice supervision to practitioners working at an advanced practice level.
3. Excellent oral and written communication skills and ability to liaise effectively with practitioners and health service management.
4. Understanding of the delivery of evidence-based programs and quality processes.
5. Capacity to undertake extensive domestic travel.
