1.0 Position Purpose

2.0 Eligibility Requirements

- A doctoral qualification in a field of relevance to Allied Health.
- A strong and sustained research track record in an area of relevance to Allied Health.
- Demonstrated capacity for effective teaching at the undergraduate and/or postgraduate level.

3.0 Key Responsibilities

- Contribute to the advancement of knowledge relevant to Allied Health through a diverse range of research contributions including producing and publishing high impact and high-quality research and scholarly work.
- Undertake high-quality and impactful cross-disciplinary research of national and international standing and attract nationally competitive research funding.
- Contribute to leadership of Allied Health research within the School and University including research mentoring and research capacity building.
- Develop meaningful and impactful research partnerships by actively engaging and collaborating with external stakeholders.
- Ensure consistently high-quality experiences and outcomes are achieved for and by higher degree research (HDR) candidates.
- Promote and enhance HDR programs and develop strategies to encourage a pipeline of strong HDR students.
- Foster an outstanding student experience and encourage active participation and engagement in student learning.
- Support, ensure and maintain compliance with relevant legislation and University policies

and procedures, including equity and health & safety and exhibit good practice in relation to same.

- Be a leading example of the principles and values embodied in the University's Code of Conduct, and behave, act and communicate at all times to reflect fairness, ethics and professionalism.
